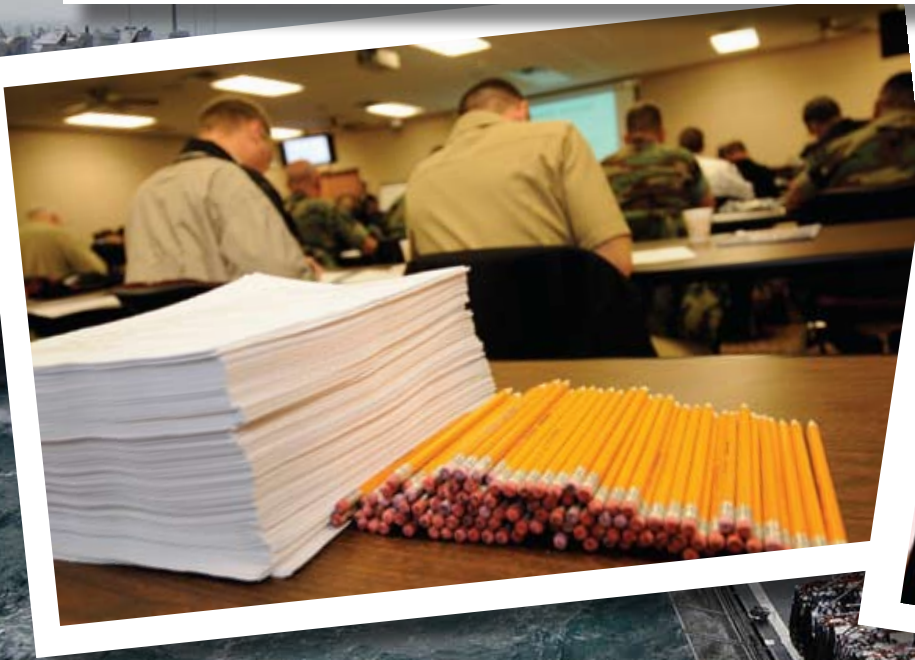


CHS Trains Navy at Naval Air Station, Pensacola
